# eBooks

**Borrow them FREE from your library!**  
Thousands of current, popular and best-seller titles are available for loan; all you need is a library card in good standing.

**KENTUCKY LIBRARIES UNBOUND (KLU), powered by OverDrive,** is a group of Kentucky libraries who combine their purchasing power to offer a huge shared pool of digital media (eBooks, audio books, music and movies). Go to:

and click on *eBooks*. You should know that the process is complicated by copyright rules and procedures put in place *by the publishers*. For example, one eBook can be loaned to only one patron at a time. So for popular books, we must buy more than one copy. You may have to wait in line by placing an “ehold.” Some publishers even limit the number of checkouts before an eBook expires and must be re-purchased.

**AND... free eBooks** are available from many online web sites – usually older titles with expired copyright. Millions of these completely free titles are available; check the library’s web site for sources.

**Purchase** ebooks from online web sites, often from the vendor of your device (e.g., buy from Amazon.com if you have a Kindle™, from bn.com if you have a Nook™, or from Sony Bookstore if you have a Reader. ™)



# eReaders

Popular brands include Amazon® **Kindle™**, Barnes & Noble® **Nook™**, and Sony® **Reader™**, but many more models and devices are on the market for reading eBooks, including tablet computers and smart phones. Choosing the “right” one for you involves comparing costs and features, as well as your individual budget and preferences. About file formats:

**epub** is the industry-standard file format for eBooks, used by almost all devices **except Kindle™. eBooks loaned by libraries are mostly in epub format.**

**pdf** files are primarily intended for attractive presentation on paper. These files may not re-size well to small devices. A few library-loaned eBooks are pdf.

**html** files are formatted for display in a web browser, on a computer screen.

**NOTE: ALL files for KINDLE™ must currently be purchased from Amazon.** Library-loan compatibility is expected soon; ask library staff for details.

## Your Own eReader

Check out and download free titles from the library’s web site via KLU, or any other online source, using your own computer OR any wireless Internet access point (including the library’s wireless), as required or permitted by your device. You MAY download copyright-free files ONLY to YOUR OWN eReader using the library’s public computers, but you MAY NOT download or save any copyrighted titles onto or using public computers, due to software *and* publisher restrictions.

## OR a Library eReader

The library has a few eReaders that are available for checkout –currently the Sony® Reader™ Pocket Edition, which is small enough to fit in a shirt pocket and weighs less than six ounces, but can hold over a thousand books! Lots of copyright-free eBooks are permanently loaded onto these eReaders; check one out to read at your leisure! **ALSO, the library staff will download up to three titles you request onto a loaner eReader.** These may be free titles you have found, or titles you have *already checked out* from KLU (ask the staff about how to do this). Please allow 24 hours for an eReader to be prepared for pickup when you request special titles. You MAY NOT download or save *anything* onto a library eReader.
